BRAD TILDEN, RAND'S HATS

Get a first-hand education of the makings of the iconic 10-gallon hats of cowboy culture and Billings' connections to Hollywood from Brad Tilden of Rand's Hats.

TERRY STEINER, YELLOWSTONE COUNTY MUSEUM

If you're a person who likes to immerse yourself in the rich heritage of your vacation destination, be sure to stop by and see Terry Steiner at the Yellowstone County Museum for some in-depth local knowledge.



SHEA DAWSON, THIRSTY STREET BREWING

Get to know Shea Dawson of Thirsty Street Brewing, one of the brewmasters behind Billings' enviable craft beer scene. Thirsty Street is of one nine breweries that make up the Billings Brew Trail along with three distilleries, a cider mill and a winery.





THERESA KUHLMANN-BUTCHER, BITTER CREEK OUTFITTERS

A second-generation rancher, Theresa is one of Billings' biggest fans. When she's not helping to manage her family's cattle ranch, she sometimes offers horseback riding tours of the surrounding terrain. Just be sure to reach out ahead of time to make sure rides are available.

JEFF EWELT, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, ZOOMONTANA

Learn what Jeff likes to do in Billings when he's not caring for amazing animals. ZooMontana is home to beloved residents Winston (a two-toed sloth) and Pabu (a red panda) among other fascinating species.

NOTABLE FIGURES

PRESTON BOYD MOSS

Arriving in town in 1892, Preston Boyd Moss, known as P.B., was a prominent figure in Billings' business development. He was a well-known banker and entrepreneur who founded a newspaper that was a forerunner to the *Billings Gazette* and started the Billings Utility Company– along with many other companies. His legacy and impact on Billings' early years is undeniable.

FREDERICK BILLINGS

Frederick Billings made a name for himself during the gold rush, eventually becoming California's first Attorney General. Billings purchased one of the original twelfth interests in the Northern Pacific Railway and served as its president. As the railway expanded, his legacy left a lasting impression. So much so, Billings, Montana was named after him.

YELLOWSTONE KELLY

The Moss Mansion

Luther Sage "Yellowstone" Kelly was one of the most notable American veterans. Kelly was laid to rest in June of 1929 with full military honors overlooking the Yellowstone Valley. Today, the Yellowstone Kelly Interpretive Site sits atop Swords Rimrock Park and overlooks Downtown Billings. The site serves as a memorial to honor Kelly's name and significant contributions.



AGRICULTURE IS MONTANA'S #1 INDUSTRY


One of the most important economic factors in Billings is its agriculture industry. Continuing to forge a path of growth, Billings' diverse climate and fertile soil help farmers and ranchers produce a wide variety of quality food products, including the top two commodities – beef and wheat.

HAZEL HUNKINS-HALLINAN

Born in the late 19th century, Hunkins-Hallinan was a Billings native, women's rights activist and suffragist. After being denied the opportunity to teach chemistry because she was a woman, despite having earned her master's degree in the subject, she joined the National Women's Party that had been organizing in Montana and dedicated her life to equality for women.

KEVIN RED STAR

Renowned for his authentic works of art depicting Native American culture, Kevin Red Star grew up on the Crow reservation outside of Billings. His work has been featured at the Smithsonian's National Museum of the American Indian, the Heard Museum in Phoenix (AZ), and the Whitney Western Art Museum.

TRAILS YOU DON'T WANT TO MISS



 NEED A REASON TO BELIEVE BILLINGS WAS MADE FOR OUTSIDERS? WE HAVE 47 OF THEM. BILLINGS OFFERS HUNDREDS OF ACRES OF CITY PARKS AND 47 MILES OF WALKING AND BIKING TRAILS THAT SURROUND THE CITY. FORGE YOUR OWN PATH TO THESE RECOMMENDED TRAILS.

APPROXIMATELY 7 MILES OF TRAILS ARE ALONG THE LEGENDARY YELLOWSTONE RIVER. BRING A PICNIC LUNCH AND DIP YOUR TOES IN THE WATER. The stretch of trail along the **RIMROCKS** off Airport Road (Highway 3) is a fantastic place to gaze out upon the mountains. These sandstone bluffs surround the city and are estimated to be at least 70 million years old. On a clear day, five mountain ranges can be seen from the trail: Pryor, Big Horn, Bull, Crazy and Absaroka-Beartooth. For history buffs, this stretch of trail is a historic mecca. View Yellowstone Kelly Interpretive Site, the legends of Black Otter Trail, Boothill Cemetery and much more!

Head to VisitBillings.com/outdoor-enthusiasts to access a complete guide of the Billings trail system.

Billings has 39 city parks and several excellent wild land parks outside city limits. With everything from pools to trails, from tennis to basketball, from picnic tables to playgrounds, there's a park for everyone in Billings. Pick the park for you at billingsparks.org. Take in history and architecture with a ride, walk or run through **DOWNTOWN BILLINGS.** Discover buildings like the Western Heritage Center (the original Parmly Billings Library) and the Historic Train Depot along Montana Avenue. Dive in a little deeper and explore the historic buildings and businesses that began Billings' legacy along with the modern updates that keep Montana's City buzzing today. **GEO-CACHING** is another great way to explore the Trailhead. With more than 500 geo-cache treasures in the city of Billings alone, this is an ideal way to get outside, take in the history and marvel at the views of five mountain peaks in the distance. Take home some Montana trinkets and leave behind something from your hometown.

SWORDS RIMROCK PARK

Billings is the trailhead to Montana, and Swords Rimrock Park is the trailhead to Billings. This in-town escape provides breathtaking views, historic icons, paved recreational trails and a Billings experience that should not be missed. The new Skyline Trail connects Zimmerman Park with Swords Park to now offer 7 miles of paved trails on top of the Rimrocks.

Head less than five miles down the road from the Trailhead for sandstone hiking and biking loop tracks with great views of the city. Bring your pup along for the adventure!

BLACK OTTER TRAIL

A road only to be traversed by hearty vehicles, this is best explored by bike or on foot and offers great views of the city.

Park your vehicle, hop on the trail and take a moment to breathe in the beauty that lays before you. Five mountain ranges meet your eyes as you look out: Pryor, Big Horn, Bull, Crazy and Absaroka-Beartooth. Downtown Billings is nestled below historic icons.

SKYLINE TRAIL

A paved, multi-use trail that makes the Rimrocks more accessible to runners, walkers, bicyclists and people using assistive mobility devices. Skyline Trail connects with the paved trail at Swords Rimrocks Park, to now offer a continuous 7 miles of paved path atop the Rims.

YELLOWSTONE KELLY INTERPRETIVE SITE

RIMROCKS

Truly a man of the frontier; "Yellowstone" Kelly requested to be laid to rest in Montana, thus this iconic veteran is buried here.

YELLOWSTONE RIVER

The longest running undammed river in the United States runs through our back door. Along the river's 678 miles are changes in water temperature, turbidity (sediment) and fish species. Historically known for Lewis and Clark's use of it.

♦ WALK, HIKE OR MOUNTAIN BIKE

Check out any of these excellent in-town treks within 20 minutes of downtown Billings.

RIVERFRONT PARK and TWO MOON PARK offer leisurely walks or bike rides along the Yellowstone River. These parks boast an abundance of foliage and are a great place to take in the wildlife. A notable site at Two Moon Park is the Weeping Wall which hugs the northwest side of the park and "weeps" water year-round.

ZIMMERMAN PARK, SWORDS RIMROCK PARK and ACTON RECREATIONAL AREA all offer more

challenging hiking and mountain biking options amongst sandstone formations on and around the Rimrocks. These areas provide great views of the city and surrounding areas. The trails in these parks are more technical, with cliffs and steep drop-offs existing throughout.

TOP FIVE MUST-SEE ATTRACTIONS

Whether you have a few hours or several days in Billings, be sure to make the most of your time. Here is a list of Billings' must-see attractions you won't want to miss. There is something for every adventure type in Billings.

BEARTOOTH HIGHWAY

This scenic pass, just west of Red Lodge, is Montana's most beautiful gateway to Yellowstone Park (125 miles). The highway is open Memorial Day through Labor Day, weather permitting.

LITTLE BIGHORN BATTLEFIELD NATIONAL MONUMENT

This monument commemorates the Sioux and Cheyenne victory over the Seventh Cavalry. The Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument features museum exhibits, an interpretive center, and ranger-led programs.

POMPEYS PILLAR NATIONAL MONUMENT

Home to some of the only remaining physical evidence of the Lewis and Clark Expedition, plus breathtaking views of the Yellowstone River Valley and a terrific interpretive center.

SCENIC DRIVE ALONG THE RIMROCKS

Drive Highway 3 from east to west and take in the forever views that make up Billings from 500 feet above the city.

YELLOWSTONE RIVER

The longest free-flowing river in the lower 48 states and a beautiful place to enjoy. Take a leisurely walk or cast in a line - either way the river cannot be missed.

LITTLE BIGHORN BATTLEFIELD

NATIONAL MONUMENT

Located less than an hour from Billings, Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument memorializes the site of the Battle of the Little Bighorn which took place on June 25-26, 1876 between the United States Seventh Cavalry Regiment led by Lt. Col. George Armstrong Custer, and the Sioux and Cheyenne under the political and spiritual leadership of Sitting Bull. **THE LITTLE BIGHORN BATTLEFIELD**

NATIONAL MONUMENT was originally named Custer Battlefield National Monument, but President George H.W. Bush renamed the site in 1991. It is now representative of those who were in the battle: Native Americans and the 7th Cavalry. This historic monument is located near Crow Agency on I-90 E, exit 510 (61.7 miles).

President Teddy Roosevelt made Yellowstone the world's first National Park. Geysers, mud pots, painted canyons, wildlife and recreation make this park the best in the world. From Memorial Day to Labor Day, take Highway 212 to **YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK** via Red Lodge and Cooke City (130 miles).

- Retrace the Lewis and Clark Expedition at **POMPEYS PILLAR NATIONAL MONUMENT**, where William Clark carved his name into this sandstone lookout rock, some of the only remaining physical evidence of the expedition. Head East on I-94 (28 miles).
- Outdoor enthusiasts will be in awe of the spectacular **BIGHORN CANYON NATIONAL RECREATION**


AREA and **YELLOWTAIL DAM**. The 71-mile-long lake, straddling the Montana-Wyoming border, is one of the largest canyons in the U.S. Follow I-90 to Hardin, then Highway 313 to Fort Smith (90 miles). Visit the log home and farmstead of Chief Plenty Coups at **CHIEF PLENTY COUPS STATE PARK** of the Crow tribe whose bravery, leadership and vision helped bridge the gap between two cultures. Take Highway 416 to • Pryor (35 miles).

- The PICTOGRAPH CAVE STATE PARK has been in the making for thousands of years. Explore three caves and see evidence of habitation from 2,000 years ago. Visit the Visitor Interpretive Center and explore ancient artifacts. Hop on I-90 E to Coburn Rd. (7.6 miles).
- A 64-acre reservoir, **LAKE ELMO STATE PARK** is an urban playground for outdoor adventurers – and four-legged pups. Walk the 1.4-mile nature trail around the lake, cast a line off of Roger's Pier, or set sail on the lake's calm waters. Bring the dogs to play at the 200-square-foot fenced-in dog park. Follow US-87 N to Highway 312 (5.7 miles).
- Southeast of Billings is the ROSEBUD BATTLEFIELD STATE PARK. This National Historic Landmark on the rolling prairie of Eastern Montana preserves the site of the June 17, 1876 battle that was a harbinger to the Battle of Little Bighorn. Take I-90 E (109 miles).
- Travel where the tyrannosaurus and triceratops once roamed at MAKOSHIKA STATE PARK, Montana's largest state park. Dinosaur fossils have been discovered across the 11,538-acre park. Pop into the on-site visitors center to check out the geology and fossil displays, including a triceratops skull. Follow I-94 E (220 miles).

SOUTHEAST MONTANA

Out here, big sky meets big adventure. It's the kind of place to slow down and fall in love with Montana. It's the kind of place where cowboys still ride horses across the open plains. It's the kind of place where traces of dinosaur fossils are just waiting to be discovered because history is ever-present. Out here, you will be welcomed with an abundance of Western hospitality.
