

FACILITIES

Billings boasts nearly a dozen sports facilities to accommodate soccer, track & field, volleyball, basketball, baseball, softball and beyond. From the large arena at MetraPark to facilities for smaller events, explore all of Billings' venues for your next competition.



SPORTS FACILITIES:



INDOOR: Signal Peak Ice Arena

This state-of-the-art two-sheet facility opens in Spring 2026, featuring two NHL-sized rinks, including a 2,000-spectator marquee rink, a full-service restaurant, pro shop, and multiple meeting/hosting spaces.

ARC Sport Courts

Bordering the Signal Peak Ice Arena, the ARC Sport Courts feature four NCAA-sized basketball courts, convertible to eight volleyball courts within a 57,000 sq ft space.

The Flying Pickle

Opening in 2026, the Flying Pickle is Billings' premier indoor pickleball facility, offering 15 courts, a full-service pro shop and restaurant, along with other state-of-the-art amenities.

OUTDOOR: Amend Park

A 60-acre, multi-use recreational campus that serves mainly as the region's largest soccer tournament hub. Amend features multiple grass fields as well as a premier 'championship' turf field with seating for 500 people and lights.

Daylis Stadium

Sitting at the center of Billings, Daylis Stadium is a 5,000-seat stadium home to high school football, soccer and track. The facility, opened in 1929, is set for a \$15 million facelift, with renovations slated to be completed in late 2026.

Dehler Park

Built in 2008, Dehler Park is the 3,000-seat home of the Billings Mustangs baseball team. It is consistently ranked as one of the best minor league baseball stadiums in the region, with a full 360-degree wide concourse allowing 5,000+spectators for a variety of events.

Stewart Park

A 54-acre complex of nine softball/baseball fields, including Joe Pirtz Field, home of Billings' American Legion baseball program.

Landon's Miracle Field

A custom-designed special needs baseball facility that serves children and adults who suffer from any physical or mental disabilities. Opened in 2022, it is one of only two Miracle League fields in the state.



MetraPark

A 189-acre complex that houses multiple facilities, including Montana's largest indoor venue, the 10,000-seat First Interstate Arena. MetraPark is also home to a brand new 3,000-seat outdoor rodeo arena and over 100,000 square feet of convention space.

AIR SERVICE MAP





POINTS OF INTEREST

Bucket-list attractions like Yellowstone National Park, Mount Rushmore, the Badlands and Little Bighorn Battlefield are all within reach for participants arriving early or staying late.

- 1 Pompeys Pillar National Monument Home to some of the only remaining physical evidence of the Lewis and Clark Expedition, plus breathtaking views of the Yellowstone River Valley and a terrific interpretive center.
- 2 Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument This national monument is on the grounds where Native
 American forces led by Crazy Horse and Sitting Bull
 defeated the U.S. Army troops of Lt. Col. George Custer in
 the Battle of the Little Bighorn in 1876. The site is a short
 drive from Billings.
- 3 Beartooth Highway Forbes calls it one of the country's most dazzling drives. This scenic pass is Montana's most beautiful gateway to Yellowstone National Park.
- 4 Chief Joseph Scenic Byway Chief Joseph led the Nez Perce Indians out of Yellowstone National Park and into Montana along this same route in 1877. Catch panoramic views at Dead Indian Mountain Pass on WY Hwy 296.

- Yellowstone National Park The world's first National Park. Geysers, mud pots, painted canyons, wildlife and recreation make this one of the best in the world.
- 6 Makoshika State Park Travel where the tyrannosaurus and triceratops once roamed at Makoshika State Park, Montana's largest state park. Watch your step, as dinosaur fossils have been discovered across the 11,538-acre park.
- 7 Devils Tower National Monument Towering 1,000 feet above the Belle Fourche River, this naturally formed landscape is one of the most astounding geological features in the country.
- Mount Rushmore National Monument 60-foot portraits of past presidents carved into granite. Do we need to say more?
- Badlands National Park Celebrate natural wonders featuring dramatic landscapes of rock formations, canyons, and spires.
- Glacier National Park Inspiring glacier-carved peaks and valleys running through Montana's Rocky Mountains into Canada.

Billings is home to the acclaimed Billings Brew Trail. Discover local craft beverages as you revel in victory.




Affordability
