SWORDS RIMROCK PARK

Billings is the trailhead to Montana, and Swords Rimrock Park is the trailhead to Billings. This in-town escape provides breathtaking views, historic icons, paved recreational trails and a Billings experience that should not be missed. Enjoy two miles of paved trails in the park and go on to enjoy the approximate five-mile ride to the river.



ZIMMERMAN PARK
Head less than five miles down the road from the Trailhead for sandstone hiking and biking loop tracks with great views of the city. Bring your pup along for the adventure!

4.7 miles from the TRAILHEAD

BLACK OTTER TRAIL
A road only to be traversed by hearty vehicles, this is best explored by bike or on foot and offers great views of the city.

TRAILHEAD
Park your vehicle, hop on the trail and take a moment to breathe in the beauty that lays before you. Five mountain ranges meet your eyes as you look out: Pryor, Big Horn, Bull, Crazy and Absaroka-Beartooth. Downtown Billings is nestled below historic icons and forever views await.

YELLOWSTONE KELLY INTERPRETIVE SITE
Truly a man of the frontier, "Yellowstone" Kelly requested to be laid to rest in Montana, thus this iconic veteran is buried here.

BOOTHILL CEMETERY
A historic cemetery with mostly unknown gravesites from the historic Coulson community.

RIMROCKS
The cliffs surrounding Billings are composed of fine-grained sand and silty mud deposited 70 to 80 million years ago in offshore bars of a great inland sea.

YELLOWSTONE RIVER
The longest running undammed river in the United States runs through our back door. Along the river's 678 miles are changes in water temperature, turbidity (sediment) and fish species. Historically known for Lewis and Clark's use of it.
